Articling Placement Mentor Program Mentor Enrolment Form

The Articling Office implements an Articling Placement Mentor Program (Mentor Program) to assist candidates seeking articles. The objective of the mentor program is to provide a candidate who is available and looking for an articling position with a support link by pairing the candidate with a member of the profession who will provide advice, support and encouragement in the search for an articling position.

Mentors meet with their assigned mentee from time to time to discuss issues of concern and to provide advice on strategies the mentee might employ in their job search.
